The planner

Your planner is the key to you being able to succeed this year.

If used correctly, it will enable you to keep on top of your workload and manage your time effectively. This is you taking control of the 'controllables'.

Your Tutor will check your planner every week to help you stay on top of the organisation. Poor planners will result in your having to buy a new planner and spend time copying up the information into it.




No pages should be torn out of the planner and it must be kept free of graffiti

How to use your planner

TIP: Turn down the page of paperclip it once the week is finished.

Space to write a full description of the homework set.



Which week we are on in case you are unsure. We have a two week timetable to allow for you to study as many subjects as you can.

When is the work due? Also write it on the date it is due in.

Your Tutor will now model this for you and you will write your first piece of homework into your planner.

Your planner

This will be the single best piece of equipment that you have and will enable you to be a successful learner. However, very few people use it correctly.

What kind of information do you record in it?


What is your planner routine?


Your planner should contain every date, deadline or key info you are given!

A planner is to keep you organised, but you need to practise using it to see the benefits!

Everyone can get better at being organised and a planner is the best way to do this.

Being well organised is the key to being successful and this skill will stay with you for life!





Put page markers in your planner to help you find this week's page easily in class.



Write in the date it is due and go to that date and write it in there too.

Write a detailed account of homework – not just the basics

Check your planner every night when you get home for homework. Try to do homework on the day it is set.

Write other reminders in your planner – such as 'Buy Dad a b/day pressie' or 'Football trials tonight in Boys' Gym' – Get used to checking it!

Make an effort to keep this routine up – it **WILL** make a difference.

Consequences



When students make poor choices at Ecco, they will be issued with a 'consequence'.

Your parents can see these via the new Sims Parent App, as well as your merits.

The system is built to give you the chance to make the right choices, but it is your responsibility to make these choices.

Teachers have the right to teach quality lessons without disruption and this will be our priority. We also expect respect of everyone in the Ecco family, so conduct on corridors and in free time needs to be exemplary.

C1 - First Verbal Warning

Your lave challenged classroom expectations. The teacher has issued you a C1. You now have the chance to correct your behaviour, you will receive no further sanction if you take that chance.

a. I have taken the opportunity to improve my behaviour and can continue with my learning.

b. I continue to disrupt my learning and the learning of others. You will now receive a C2.



C2 - Second Verbal Warning

You have chosen to challenge expectations. Your teacher may ask you to move seats in the classroom, stay behind at the end of the lesson or attend a detention to catch up with your work.

a. I have chosen to correct my behaviour and will only receive the C2 sanction.

b. I have chosen to continue to disrupt my learning and the learning of others. I will now receive a C3.

C3 - Removal to the Buddy Room

I have chosen to continue to disrupt my learning and the learning of others. I now need to quickly make my way to the Department Buddy Room and complete my work for the remaining part of the lesson in this room.

- a. I have chosen to correct my behaviour and have completed my work. I will receive a C3 sanction of a Whole School Detention.
- I have chosen to continue to disrupt or complete little work. I will now receive a C4.
 On Call will be requested and I will be placed in the Reflection Room.

C4 - Removal to the Reflection Room

Room teacher. You will now work in the Reflection Room and a whole school detention will be set. A text will be sent home to inform parents / carers of the C4.

Immediate C4 will be issues for the following

- Continued violations of Uniform, Makeup, Jewellery (refusal to remove or put on)
- Poor/Dangerous behaviour at social times/on corridors
- Persistently refusing reasonable requests (1 day in the Reflection Room)
- Persistent disruption to learning (multiple On-Calls x4 C3 incidents in a week)

Late to Lesson

Late to lesson detention will be issued again and will result in a same day detention if you arrive to lesson without a note from a member of staff. Going to the toilet between lessons or filling up your water bottle is not an excuse for being late to lesson and will result in a detention.

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Fire Evacuation



When the fire bell rings


- Keep calm and quiet!
- Listen to your teacher for instruction
- Leave your classroom calmly and in silence, leaving all belongings behind.

You can replace belongings, you can't replace YOU!

Exit via the nearest safe exit

Assembly Point

 Silently form an orderly line in front of your Mentor Group sign.

 Line up in alphabetical order by your SURNAME

 Remain silent and listen while your mentor registers you! Your mentor needs to check everyone is present, so needs to be heard.





Refuge Points



- If you need help leaving the building, make your way to one of these points on any upper floor staircase
- Students (and adults) with a Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan (PEEP) will know the routine and should always have their Red & Green Cards with them to give to staff.
- If unsure ask a member of staff for help.







Return to the building

- Mentors will tell you when to return to the building
- Walk silently and in good order back to the building
- Return immediately to your classroom
- Your teacher will check that everyone has returned back to the lesson



Summary

- When you hear the fire alarm sound, exit the building calmly and in silence, via the nearest safe exit
- If you need assistance leaving the building, wait at a refuge point on any staircase
- Once out of the building, report to your designated assembly point
- At your assembly point, line up in silence and in alphabetical SURNAME order
- When instructed, return to the building and go immediately back to your classroom





Fire Evacuation

Do not assume it is a drill – you must always act as if it is a real fire and follow the instructions within the presentation – you teacher will also direct you at the time.

Your Tutor will now model the fire evacuation procedure as if the alarm was sounding right now.

Remember to exit via the nearest exit, leave all belongings, line up in the correct place in alphabetical order and in silence.
