Headline figures for 2015/16 outcomes

<p>Progress 8</p> <p>What is this? This calculation is based on students' outcomes in 8 key subjects: English and Maths (which are double weighted), 3 'Ebacc' subjects (2 sciences, computer science, history and/ or geography) and 3 other subjects. Across the whole country it will average out as 0. P8 scores will range broadly from -1.0 to +1.0</p>	<p>-0.17</p> <p>What the school says about this: we are obviously extremely disappointed to have a negative progress 8. In large part this is due to disappointing outcomes in core subjects, which (especially Maths and English) are so integral to the successes of the school. In 2014/15, our P8 score had been positive and we are confident that we can address outcomes for our current Y11 – while maintaining our commitment to a broad and balanced, academic curriculum – so that P8 is positive again next year.</p>
<p>Attainment 8</p> <p>What is this? This is the average grade achieved by all students in the 8 subjects above.</p>	<p>4.82</p> <p>What the school says about this: This equates to a C- grade.</p>
<p>% Students achieving C and above grades in English and Maths</p>	<p>52%</p> <p>What the school says about this: The disappointing outcomes in maths and English clearly had an impact on this figure. Individually, 59% of students attained a C or above grade in English while 57% attained a C or above grade in Maths.</p>
<p>% students achieving the English Baccalaureate</p> <p>What is this? The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) is a suite of subjects that the government believes represents a gold standard in academic education. To achieve the EBacc, students must achieve C or above grades in English (Language or Literature – as long as both have been studied), maths, two sciences, a modern foreign language and history or geography.</p>	<p>28%</p> <p>What the school says about this: we are proud of the academically challenging curriculum we offer and the stretch and challenge it offers to all learners. 65% of our students follow a curriculum that allows them to achieve the full suite of qualifications that would allow them to achieve the EBacc.</p>

Other outcomes**93% 5+A*-GEM – GCSE only**

What the school says about this: our commitment to students accessing high-quality qualifications irrespective of their academic abilities is evident here. 93% of our learners leave with good qualifications that are valued by employers and have currency in the outside world. This exceeds the national figure for the whole country in 2014/15 by 31%. Further, this figure is evidence of our inclusivity as a school: no learners are lost and we make real or pledge to serve our community and all our students, irrespective of their needs.
