D-Assessment

objective 1

Some basic facts but showing understanding of the artist/ style and relating to own work. You will have several basic drawings. These will be shaded fairly carefully. The research will be presented together with title and printed pictures. This will probably be an A2 sheet of Drawings and research.

C- Assessment objective

Some clear facts and own opinions written well using possibly thinking hats or Kipling's questions to select and present useful information well. There will be several accurate and well shaded drawings, pictures and a title presented well. This will probably be two A2 sheets of drawings and research.

<u>B- Assessment</u> objective 1

Clear facts and own opinions About two or more artists comparing them. They will link closely to own designs. Drawings will be in more than one media and will look accurate will media used well. There will probably be three or more A2 sheets of research presented very well and with high level of drawing skill.

<u>A- Assessment</u> objective 1

Clear and well explained facts and own opinions about two or more artists comparing them. They will have media and themes matching your own ideas and plans. Drawings will be in more than one media and will show a high level of skill and accuracy in all media. There will probably be four or more A2 sheets of research presented very well and with excellent level of drawing skill.



D-Assessment

objective 2

At least two sheets with four or five basic drawings of yours (not an artists) one of these may be a real object drawing or drawing from your own photo. You will also have eight or more printed pictures, postcards or photos. There will be pencil and another media. Annotation is used.

C- Assessment

objective2

You will have plenty(10+) pictures, photos , postcards of your ideas(not artists). These will link well to your artists themes and your studies will be well shaded and accurate. You will have at least three A2 back sheets of mounted research or the same amount in a sketchbook. You will have shown lots of experiments in three or more media. Annotation is used to explain ideas.

<u>B- Assessment objective</u> <u>2</u>

You will have plenty(10+) pictures, photos, postcards of your ideas(not artists). These will link well to your artists themes and your studies will be well shaded and look realistic. You will have at least four A2 back sheets of mounted research or the same amount in a sketchbook. You will have shown lots of experiments in different media which you use with skill. Ideas are annotated well.


A- Assessment objective 2
