- 1. Explain what the following words mean: nomadic, bands and tribe
- 2. List the different <u>tasks</u> Indians needed to complete in order to survive. Next to each point note down who was responsible for the task. Explain what this allocation of tasks suggest about the Indians.
- 3. Draw a picture of a buffalo. <u>Label</u> the parts of a buffalo the Indians would use explaining what they would use the part for.
- 4. Create a mind map to illustrate government policy towards the Indians. Be sure to mention the Acts by name and how they impacted on the Indians
- 5. Create a table to show the <u>pull and push</u> factors for westward migration
- 6. Explain which factor you think is the most influential
- 7. Create a fact file for the Homestead Act and the First Transcontinental Railroad. Which do you think was more important in encouraging the settlement of the west.
- 8. Draw a picture of a Homestead and label the <u>problems</u> farmers on the plains encountered. Around the drawing add what farmers did to overcome these problems
- 9. Create a flow diagram to show the terms and consequences of the Fort Laramie Treaty (1851)
- 10. Create a mind map illustrating the reasons for the growth in the cattle industry
- 11. Draw a table to show the differences on the plains before and after homesteading
- 12. Do a mind map of the factors which impacted on the Plains Indians (1862 76). Highlight the factors you consider to be the most important and add links between the factors
- 13. Create a fact file on the Battle of Little Big Horn
- 14. Write a narrative account analysing the ways in which the cattle industry grew in the years 1865–74.

You may use the following in your answer:

- The Goodnight-Loving Trail (1866)
- The introduction of barbed wire (1874)
- You **must** also use information of your own.
