





You must visit at least 4 continents and 15 different countries. Try to visit a range of different biomes! ❖ Find Maps - Look around your house or on the internet for maps in everyday life. Find an example of a helpful map and an example of an unhelpful map. Analyse what makes the maps helpful or not. ❖ Design a treasure hunt – Map out the area in your garden/around your house and write geographical clues. E.g. Use compass directions, clues and map symbols.
