<p>Progress 8</p> <p>What is this? This calculation is based on students' outcomes in 8 key subjects: English and Maths (which are double weighted), 3 'Ebacc' subjects (2 sciences, computer science, MFL, history and/ or geography) and 3 other subjects. Across the whole country it will average out as 0. P8 scores will range broadly from -1.0 to +1.0. A positive P8 demonstrates achievement in the top 50% of schools in the country.</p>	<p>+0.03</p> <p>What the school says about this: we are extremely pleased to have returned to a positive Progress 8 score following the dip in 2015/16 (when the figure was negative -0.19). Securing good outcomes in core subjects, which (especially Maths and English) is integral to the successes of the school and remains a key target. We will once again be restless in pursuit of the very best outcomes for students in these key qualifications. We are confident that we can further improve our practice and provision so that outcomes for our current Y11 are good, while maintaining our commitment to a broad and balanced, academic curriculum.</p>
<p>Attainment 8</p> <p>What is this? This is the average grade achieved by all students in the 8 subjects above.</p>	<p>4.57</p> <p>What the school says about this: This equates to a strong C grade/ grade 4 ('Standard Pass')</p>
<p>% Students achieving grade 4 and above in English and Maths</p>	<p>61% 'Standard Pass'</p> <p>What the school says about this: Much improved outcomes, especially in maths, clearly had an impact on this figure, which is 9% higher than 2015/16. Individually, in English 63% of students attained at least a 'Standard Pass' while 70% attained at the equivalent level in maths.</p>
<p>% Students achieving grade 5 and above in English and Maths</p>	<p>38% 'Strong Pass'</p> <p>With regard a 'Strong Pass', 49.1% secured at least a grade 5 in maths with 40.1% attained at the equivalent grade in English.</p>
<p>% students achieving the English Baccalaureate</p> <p>What is this? The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) is a suite of subjects that the government believes represents a gold standard in academic education. To achieve the EBacc, students must achieve grade 4 or above in English (Language or Literature – as long as both have been studied), maths, two sciences, a modern foreign language and history or geography.</p>	<p>25% at 5+ 31% at 4+</p> <p>What the school says about this: we are proud of the academically challenging curriculum we offer and the stretch and challenge it provides to all learners. Outcomes at 4+ are 3% higher than 2015/16's equivalent.</p> <p>65% of our students follow a curriculum that allows them to achieve the full suite of qualifications that would allow them to achieve the EBacc, a figure that compares very favourably with other schools in the city.</p>
