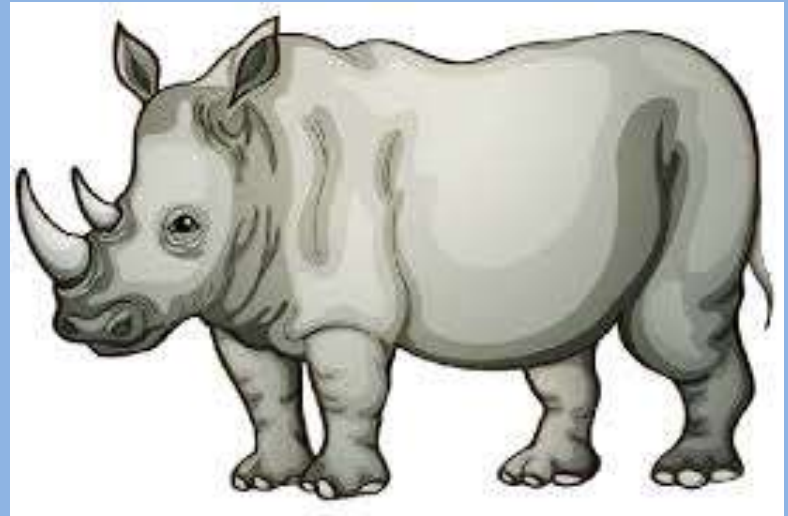

# It's all about the effort

Your final round of mock exams start on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> Feb - the first day back after half term.

In these exams, the teachers want to see where you have made progress and where the final areas of improvement need to take place.

It's important that you take them seriously, just as you would for the real exams. It's a way of preparing you for the real exams.

Your teachers need to know the gaps in your knowledge, so that they can intervene.



The exam timetable is on the Y11 area of the school website and you should have all received a copy of it too.

On the day remember to:

- ✓ Arrive to the exam hall in plenty of time. 15 mins before the exam is due to start.
- ✓ Bring an exam pack with you - see through pencil case, multiple black pens, pencils, pencil sharpener, protractor, compass, calculator (if it isn't needed, you will be told on the day) and a bottle of water with the label removed. Packs are available for sale on the day.
- ✓ As you arrive, you will be registered by staff and then shown into the hall where you will leave all of your belongings in the changing rooms - including your phones.
- ✓ You will be asked to turn out your pockets on the way into the exam hall - this is for your own benefit. You cannot have ANYTHING in your pockets, even a receipt!

✓ Try your best! Maximum effort on all questions, all papers, all subjects!

**EVERY QUESTION SHOULD BE ATTEMPTED!**

✓ Don't give up!

✓ Make sure you know how long you should spend on each paper/question. Ask your teacher if you're unsure.

Anyone who does not answer huge chunks of the paper, or simply does not attempt it will be required to resit the paper with Miss Melody and Mr Walkden after school for as long as it takes. Poor attitude towards exams is unacceptable.

Do not talk, turn round or communicate with anyone in the exam room (this includes smiling, making them laugh or whispering) - this will result in an instant fail in the exam and possible exclusion. There are no excuses for this.
